

An example of a CPD submission by a Research Professor in a university School of the Environment

Commentary

The attached submission was made by a CSci registrant who was selected for audit as part of the CSci revalidation process in 2012. The submission consists of:

- a. A 12 month summary (October 2011 to September 2012 inclusive) of the CPD programme taken from the RSS online CPD system.
- b. A completed *Chartered Scientist CPD Revalidation Form*. This form contains the relevant context and reflection information necessary to assess the CPD activity against the Science Council's standards.

As this registrant had used the RSS online CPD system, both the *reviewed Activities* and *Benefits Gained* reports were submitted. In combination they provide information on the categories of activities undertaken, the number of learning hours undertaken and the reflective practice comments describing the benefits of each activity.

The panel of assessors concluded that this submission fully met the Science Council CPD standards, including the requirements of the RSS CPD Policy.

The submission has been (partially) anonymised for the purpose of providing this exemplar of good CPD practice.

I am Research Professor in [REDACTED] in the School of the [REDACTED] Environment at the University of [REDACTED]. The School is the largest graduate school in the world in the field of built environment with 250 doctoral students studying in a variety of modes – full-time, part-time and distance-learning. The School has started, in 2012, to formalise research training and provides a comprehensive series of research workshops. In addition to directly supervising a number of PhD students, I run the workshops on statistical methodology and cater for students with a wide variety of prior statistical knowledge. This role entails:

- Assessing research students' needs in terms of statistical training.
- Developing programmes of workshops to meet these needs.
- Advising on the design of specific statistical tools for individual research projects.

This latter aspect of the work also extends to the provision of assistance for academic faculty in formulating appropriate methodologies and research design on their projects.

Also, I have been appointed Coordinator of the [REDACTED] on Construction Industry Economics, which set up a Task Group on Global Construction Data in 2012.

A large proportion of my recorded CPD over the period was accounted for by development of the statistical training workshops. Feedback from participants gave me an awareness of the need to support researchers and this activity has started to greater recruitment of research students – a core business activity of my organization.

Many of the problems encountered by my many overseas research students stem from the unreliability of published statistics on which they base their research work. I have improved my own familiarity with the published data sets of official bodies in the developing countries from which these students originate.

I have held meetings with, and developed friendly personal relationships with contacts in the national statistical units in several countries, [REDACTED].

This has definitely been of benefit to my School and I have learnt a great deal of the problems associated with the compilation of National Accounting statistics.

My CPD activities, especially the meetings with the compilers of statistics in developing countries, have ensured that my knowledge in this area is up-to-date. This knowledge has proven invaluable in assisting my PhD students to assess the validity of data used in their research work. Also, these researchers are now much more able to make their own decisions regarding choice of methodology and, for instance, have an awareness of alternative statistical tests.

An important part of our activity involves bidding for research funding from national research councils and the European Commission. Providing a service to colleagues in writing the proposed statistical methodology in their bid submissions has greatly enhanced the quality of our bids.
